



What to expect with Diamond Seal

Diamond Seal protected surfaces still get dirty. Any dirt, dust or other agents that normally cause the surface to get dirty will continue to make that surface dirty. When sealed with Diamond Seal, the surface is up to 75% easier to clean because the dirt and grime no longer penetrate the surface, but sit on top of the Diamond Seal coating. Diamond Seal coating protects the natural beauty, clarity and luster of glass, granite, ceramic tile and other natural stone.

Maintenance and cleaning of Diamond Seal

If the dirt is stubborn, using a diluted mild cleaner such as Simple Green should make your surfaces sparkle. Occasionally, dirt may build up and require a light scrub with a white #98 pad, available through your local maintenance supplier. Each of these cleaning methods is safe for your Diamond Seal protected surfaces. Do not use any *abrasive* cleaners or *abrasive* pads, other than a white #98 pad. If windows are exposed to sprinkler overspray, and have a mineral buildup, simply blade the minerals off the Diamond Seal surface with a 6-inch window-cleaning blade. Blading does not harm Diamond Seal. On other surfaces, use an old loofah pad and an approved cleaner to remove buildup.

Harsh and expensive cleaning solutions are no longer needed

Many products available through suppliers and on supermarket shelves contain acids that can harm interior and exterior building surfaces, as well as the environment. Some products may have health and bodily contact warnings. Products that include acids are designed to, among other tasks, extract minerals and dirt from surface pores, fractures or crevices. Surfaces coated with Diamond Seal do not require harsh cleaning solutions or methods. Any product that includes any acids or a combination of any acids will void your warranty.
